Situation Report: Massachusetts Swine Flu Response

June 2, 2009 at 1530 hrs – Report # 26

- Massachusetts:** 673 confirmed cases as of June 2, 2009 at 1500 hrs
****Please see the end of this report for information on confirmed cases**
- New England:** 937 confirmed cases as of June 2, 2009 at 1500 hrs
(673 in MA, 196 in CT, 40 in NH, 14 in RI, 11 in ME, 3 in VT)
- National:** 10,053 confirmed cases in 51 states / 17 deaths per CDC update Monday, June 1st at 1100 hrs ****Please note that CDC is now updating their reporting table on Monday, Wednesday and Friday only**

Federal Government declared a public health emergency which allows states to access federal resources- April 26, 2009
- International:** WHO at <http://www.who.int/csr/disease/swineflu/en/index.html>
WHO announced that it raised the level of the influenza pandemic alert from a phase 4 to a phase 5 on April 29, 2009.
**** As of 06:00 GMT, 1 June 2009, 62 countries have officially reported 17,410 cases of influenza A (H1N1) infection, including 115 deaths.**

Massachusetts H1N1 Incident Command Actions:

- MA211 received a total of 165 calls between May 28th and June 1st
- The Epidemiologists at the Hinton State Laboratory Institute received a total of 151 calls May 29th and June 1st
- Website updates:
 - Confirmed cases updated daily on the H1N1 page and the MDPH blog
 - The "Swine Flu" page has been renamed "H1N1 Influenza (Swine Flu)".

Conference Calls:

- 6/1 – Conference call with State Health Officers from New England, New York and New Jersey to provide situational awareness

Laboratory Testing:

- 306 specimens have been received at the Hinton State Laboratory since 5/29/09
- 2591 specimens have been received as of 6/01/09


