




#### There are three main approaches to making a vaccine:







Using a whole virus or bacterium

Parts that trigger the immune system

Just the genetic material

	EFFICACY	66% effective at preventing moderate to severe COVID-19; about 85% against the most serious illness.	92% effective at protection against symptomatic COVID-19 starting 14 days after the first dose.	Reduced symptomatic cases by 94% a week after the second dose; reduced severe disease by 92%
	DOSAGE	Single shot	Two shots up to 42 days apart.	Two shots 21 days apart
	STORAGE	Can be stored for at least 3 months at 36°F to 46°F.	Can be stored for up to 30 days between 36°F and 46°F	Can be stored for up to 2 weeks at -13°F to 5°F
	NUMBER OF DOSES IN THE U.S.	20 million doses by the end of March and 100	300 million doses through the end of July.	300 million doses through the end of July.

#### **FACT vs FICTION**



- There is NOT a chip injected upon vaccination
  - •The vaccine was NOT designed to eliminate people of color
    - •The vaccine does NOT give you COVID19



A Black woman, Dr. Kizzmekia Corbett, was instrumental in developing the vaccine

- •People of color participated in the vaccine trials
- Blacks and Latinos are three times more likely than whites to be hospitalized for COVID-19 and nearly twice as likely to die from it
