We write this statement because of the importance of policing and police reform. The year 2020 has brought even more attention to police reform as an important national and local issue. It is a common topic on the City Council floor. It is clear from our years on the Council that it is an issue that will not correct itself. It will take the collective efforts of all of us to implement the police reforms that will improve our policing and our community. At the core of the issue are the concepts of respect and trust.

We are ready to work with the Mayor, the administration and the police on improvements in this area. To this end, we plan to attend the Community Outreach Event on Police Reforms this Saturday morning, December 19, on Zoom. It will provide a moment for the city to come together to have a conversation, to listen to one another, to understand more deeply what the issues are, and to commit to working together on them.
