Submitted Request

A. Project Summary:

The Indian Orchard Citizens Council is seeking a CPA grant for the purpose of initially opening up swimming spots for the residents of Indian Orchard. As of today, we do not have a place to go swimming even though we have a few lakes in our area to include a Massachusetts Great Pond which is called Long Pond. In this proposal we are seeking to restore Long Pond for swimming and fishing in Indian Orchard. These are the lakes in our neighborhood. 12 Pictures attached

B. Proposal Description 1.

The restoration of Long Pond and eventually the other "watering holes" in Indian Orchard is a wish that many residents have had for years. We want to dredge out the pond and have the water tested for safety. We recently had a water test done on Loon Pond and the results were hopeful in that the water was deemed safe for swimming and fishing. The restoration of these waterways for public use will benefit the entire city of Springfield as it will give residents the option of visiting other places to swim besides Five Mile pond and the limited amount of pools we have. This project will be done in phases as stated below.

The CPA criteria for Open Spaces and Recreation is achieved with this grant by making the current open spaces in our community accessible to residents for recreation.

The need the proposal addresses is the lack of swimming areas in Indian Orchard. This lack causes overcrowding at other swimming places like our pools. The pool at Forest Park will have a line around the corner of people waiting to get in to swim. Restoring Long Pond would alleviate the need for these long lines and leaving families waiting for an opportunity to have fun in the water.

The expected outcome of this proposal is to provide families in Indian Orchard a place to have fun in the water that is closer to home. We understand that this is a long-term project that we plan on doing in phases. The first phase will be the restoring a part of Long Pond to swimming for families in Indian Orchard and the rest of the city of Springfield.

C. Feasibility & Sustainability:

We will reach out to our business partners including Eastman Chemical and other businesses in Indian Orchard who are very supportive of any efforts that the Indian Orchard Citizens Council makes. It is also hoped that the city of Springfield will provide additional support needed.

The Parks Department in the city of Springfield as well as Brett Richards of "Make MA Fishing Spots Great Again" who are determined to keep the lakes and ponds in the area clean of all debris and trash. We have obtained a letter of support from them.

The operating pro forma would be when the pond is open for swimming and fishing.

D. Applicant Experience:

The IOCC has successfully applied for and received grants for the renovation of the Godfrey Triangle in Indian Orchard which is a WWI memorial to veterans. The city is still in the process of completing this project. We have also acquired grants from the Springfield Cultural Council and Peoples Bank for our upcoming annual Food Truck Festival. We have also received grants from the Grass Roots Environmental Fund for a community garden.

The Springfield Parks Department and the Indian Orchard Citizens Council have a great track record of completing projects. The IOCC has been incorporated since 1976 and have been hosting an annual Food Truck Festival for the last 4 years. We have monthly council meetings and encourage residents to join us regularly. We have requested Charlie Arment Trucking to help us realize this proposal. They have a great track record of working on other city projects.

III. TIMELINE:

This project will be completed in phases. The first phase will be to restore a "beach" at Long Pond. Brett Richards and Charlie Arment Trucking will work together to realize this phase by Summer 2022.






