ABOUT THE SENIOR COMMUNITY SERVICE EMPLOYMENT PROGRAM

What is the Senior Community Service Employment Program (SCSEP)?

The Senior Community Service Employment Program, funded under Title V of the Older Americans Act through the U.S. Department of Labor, enables us to help employ low-income individuals, age 55 and older, throughout the Commonwealth. Enrollees are placed in temporary training assignments where they gain valuable on-the-job work experience and training needed to gain employment in the private sector. The Senior Community Employment Program (SCSEP) is the nation's oldest job training program to help unemployed individuals and older find work.

Enrollees benefit from training, counseling, and community service assignments at non-profit organizations in their communities, prior to transitioning into the private sector.

Participants are placed at eligible training sites for which they are paid minimum wage for 20 hours per week.

PROGRAM QUALIFICATIONS

- 55 years of age or older
- Unemployed
- Massachusetts resident
- Few employment prospects
- Meet low-income guidelines

- To foster and promote useful part-time opportunities in community service activities for eligible individuals
- To foster individual economic self-sufficiency
- To increase the number of older persons who may enjoy the benefits of a regular job after participating in the SCSEP

- The added results are enormous; income, work ethics and skilled labor

Host Agencies Sites are community agencies or organizations which provide on-the-job training and supervision for program participants. Host Agencies must be either non-profit or governmental agencies.

How can mature workers benefit from the Senior Community Service Employment Program?

Each participant will be counseled by our professional staff, one-on-one. A skills assessment and an individual employment plan will be developed with the participant. These tools define a person's employment strengths and identify their training needs. The participant will be enrolled and assigned to a training site, or attend formal class room training while earning income
