

Union Station Once More Has Its Usual Rush From Colleges

Smith Girls, Amherst Students, Mount Holyoke Contingents, All Help Swell Crowd Passing Through Portals of Depot

The collegiate season at the Union station is on again. Yesterday the station was filled with Smith girls and more leave tomorrow, supplemented by the earliest of the Amherst contingent and on Thursday and Friday the Mount Holyoke students will be leaving for home.

Several of the western trains came through with extra sections and additional sleeping cars yesterday and in addition three trains were made up at Northampton for the West, relieving the load that usually descends on the local station to some extent.

The Century and the Wolverine have two sections tomorrow because of the additional Wellesley students to be carried through to the West, and reservations on these trains have also been made by many of the Smith students, who will get on here.

The regular trains from Northampton yesterday were loaded to capacity and they discharged the usual excited crowd of fur clad girls from the college. The rush will reach its peak by tomorrow, according to local officials.
